About the Conference

This, the eighth Assessment Tomorrow conference in Scotland, takes ***"Digital by default-digital by design"*** its focus. The conference speakers will, through a range of presentations and case studies, look at how technology should now be seen as the "default" mechanism used for assessment and how technology can be used to help design more effective and reliable assessment. They will also use their experience to highlight what they see as the next developments in this area, looking at recent innovations in the use of technology and how these are now being adopted and developed by users and by organisations such as SQA.

The use of e-assessment has come a long way since its early, faltering introduction some 13 years ago. Now that many, if not all, the technological challenges have been addressed, we need to turn our attention to using technology as the natural vehicle for managing the assessment process, whether it is formative assessment in the classroom or workplace, more formal, accredited assessment for qualifications or programmes such as Scotland's SSLN. Given the pressures on education and training in the current financial and fiscal environment, the use of technology may also bring efficiency benefits over time.

At the same time, many teachers and others in education are only just beginning to realise the impact on them of e-assessment and the benefits it can bring. With this in mind, the speakers will include teachers who are already making beneficial use of e-assessment.
